WICHITA, Kansas - One 10-year-old's sick day home from school turned into a talk with police after a man broke into the home demanding money. Briannah and her family are amazed by the brazen behavior of the intruder, kicking in the front door in the daytime. But most of all, the family is thankful Briannah is alright and grateful for a protective pet.

Police came to the 700 block of Gouverneur to find the front door kicked in and 10-year-old Briannah Trewey shaken up.

Investigators say a tall, thin black man pounded on the front door then forced his way in and demanded money. He chased Briannah into the kitchen, but four-year-old Coco interrupted the pursuit.

"I'm really glad that she was here because I don't know what would have happened if she wasn't," said Ashley Wilson, Briannah's sister.

Briannah is doing fine now but is fearful that whoever broke in will come back. Her family is worried too and is asking for your help.

"Someone's got to know something. The world is too small for no one to know nothing. Someone's got to know something. Something worse could have happened to my little sister today," said Wilson.

"Everybody says a pit bull is vicious and you hear that on the news a lot but sometimes pit bulls are helpful," said Briannah. "And they can help you, so you might want to have an adult or a dog or something that can protect you."

Police are asking for help to find the intruder. Officers say he was between the ages of 18 and 20. They say he sped away from the home in a bluish-green Dodge. If you have any information, call your police substation or 911.
