Black Lab Attacks Neighborhood Children

A Colby Drive, Kings Park resident told police on August 5 that a black Labrador retriever belonging to a neighbor attacked his 11 year old son, biting him on the shoulder. A 12 year old girl was also bitten on the hip in the same incident. Both children developed red welts from the attack. Police contacted the dog's owner and advised him to confine his dog.
