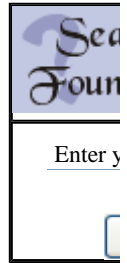

An attempted robbery of the One Stop Convenience, 140 Hadati Road, took place at 6:25pm on October 2, 2005. A lone male entered the store, approached the counter and showed the male clerk a knife that he had tucked in the waistband of his pants. The male `muttered' something to the clerk; the clerk, fearing he was about to be robbed grabbed a baseball bat from behind the counter. The male fled the store when he saw the clerk grab the baseball bat and left the area on a bicycle. There were no injuries, and nothing was taken.

The suspect is described as a white male, 18-23 years old, 5'6", medium build, wearing a goldish brown baseball hat, blue shirt and was armed with a large knife. Police were called to the Stampede Ranch on Woodlawn Road West at 1:27am on October 1, 2005, to deal with a man who refused to leave the bar. A 23-year-old Guelph man was arrested after being evicted from the bar by security staff. The man went back into the bar and refused to leave. Police were called and the man still refused to leave. The man was arrested after a brief struggle with officers. Investigation revealed that earlier in the evening the man had damaged a door in the bar.

An apartment on Speedvale Avenue West was the site of a home invasion on September 30, 2005 at 2:00pm. Six males forced their way into an apartment on Speedvale Ave W and demanded money from the three male occupants. The three men were bound with duct tape while the apartment was ransacked. The suspects fled the apartment with a small amount of cash. The three victims were able to free themselves and call police. The victims were not injured.

Suspect #1 is described as a white male, 5'9" – 5'10", 230 lbs and was wearing a white hat, yellow shirt and dark pants. Suspect #2 is described as a white male, 6'3", 300 lbs, scruffy hair and was wearing glasses. No description of the other four males is available.

N. Police are investigating a collision between a teal-coloured Volkswagen and a grey-coloured BMW. The BMW struck the Volkswagen and then fled the scene.

The BMW was last seen northbound on Victoria Rd N. There were two people in the BMW and are described as male white in their 50's. The BMW sustained damage to the front passenger side. No injuries.
