Policemen injured in dog attack

Two Thunder Bay OPP officers will be off the job for at least a week after being injured in a dog attack.

The officers were attacked by a large, mixed breed after responding to a single car accident over the weekend. The incident occurred just after 11 p.m. Saturday night, on Highway 61 near Princess Street. The driver was earlier spotted speeding on the Harbour Expressway and when he exited his vehicle at the scene of the crash, his dog attacked the officers.

One officer was bitten on his leg, the other was bitten in the arm. Officers eventually used pepper spray to subdue the dog. The policemen were treated and released from the Health Sciences centre and the dog has been quarantined. The 29-year-old Thunder Bay man faces a number of charges including, impaired driving, dangerous driving, and possession of marijuana.
