



## Murray County acknowledges calls about dog

— Murray County Animal Control received a phone call about a dog at a Chatsworth house at 1:16 p.m. on Monday, according to records provided by the Murray County sole commissioner's office.

Devon Goldman, whose 6-year-old son Will was attacked by a dog Tuesday morning, said she told animal control the dog appeared to be dangerous and was growling at her children and cats. The records did not indicate what Devon Goldman told animal control.

A second call was made to animal control Tuesday morning between 8:30 and 10, sole commissioner Jim Welch said Friday afternoon. There is no record of that call. Will Goldman was attacked around 11 a.m. at 9372 Highway 225 N. in Chatsworth, according to family members.

The animal control manager told the caller on Tuesday that an officer was in the area and would "be there shortly," Welch said. Welch declined to comment further. A woman who answered the phone for Murray County Animal Control on Tuesday had referred all questions to Welch. The dog was described in a report from animal control as a medium-sized gray and white husky mix.

Will's upper lip was split, his face punctured below his left eye and he had a bite mark to the back of his head, family members said. He also has a swollen finger, according to his grandfather, Mike Goldman. Will is recovering at home.

Mike Goldman said he has been told by health officials the dog did not have rabies and was euthanized by state officials.
