Woman requires medical attention after dog bite

A Clarksville woman on Thursday needed medical attention after she was allegedly bit by a dog while walking along Bunker Hill Road.

According to a Clarksville Police report by Officer Howard Gillespie, the victim was walking on Bunker Hill Road when a dog came from a nearby residence and attacked her.

According to the report, the victim was bitten on the buttocks and was bleeding.

Animal Control was called to the scene, which took the dog into custody. Gillespie reported that the resident from which the dog came could not be contacted. Animal Control left a notice at the residence.

Gillespie also reported that the victim would require medical attention for the bite wound.
