A 32-year-old Kiel woman is bitten by dog Tuesday, police searching for owners so victim may avoid rabies shots

KIEL — Police are searching Wednesday for owners of a white dog that bit a 32-year-old Kiel woman Tuesday evening as she was jogging near the 500 block of Wisconsin Highway 67 in Kiel, according to Police Chief David Funkhouser.

The unidentified victim could avoid a series of rabies vaccinations if the owners are found and can show proof of the dog's current vaccinations, Funkhouser said.

The incident occurred at 6:30 p.m., police said.

The dog was on leash and was being walked by an unidentified white couple, both approximately 50-60 years old, according to police.

The man was described as heavier set and was wearing a red jacket the time of the incident. The woman had blonde hair and was wearing glasses, according to police.

Police said the couple was walking a brown dog and white dog of unknown breeds at the time of the incident.

The victim later discovered the dog bite had broken her skin, police said.
