Sheboygan police seek dogs that bit teen, man

Sheboygan police are looking for two dogs responsible for biting city residents last week.

The first bite occurred about 7:45 p.m. June 23 in the 500 block of Riverfront Drive. A 17-year-old boy was jogging when he was bitten by a white cocker spaniel being walked on a leash, said Capt. Steve Cobb of the Sheboygan Police Department.

The boy was unable to provide a description of the dog owner.

On Friday, a 49-year-old Sheboygan man was bitten on the leg while entering the Q Mart at 1006 Geele Ave. The dog, described as a light brown boxer-type dog, was being held by an approximately 7-year-old girl who also had a small white terrier on a leash.

After the dog bite, a white or Hispanic woman with long dark hair came out of the gas station and left the area with the girl and dogs. They were last seen heading east on Logan Avenue from North 10th Street.
