

## South Toledo Bulldog Attacks

The Lucas County Dog Warden says, "you can't predict how they're going to behave."

Another dog attack in the city; this time a man walking in alley was bitten. It happened behind Spencer Road in South Toledo.

Some in the neighborhood say the dog runs around on the loose and chases people. The dog warden's office says that's why there are restrictions on the breed.

Walt Raftery, the Lucas County Dog Warden says, "you can't predict how they're going to behave. They can act friendly you know one minute and then, you know, they see something they're not sure about and they attack."

The Lucas county dog warden says he will send three citations to court. Officials say the man went to the hospital with a minor leg injury.

"KO" or "Knock Out" is an American bulldog a breed considered a pit bull. The owner refused to voluntarily give up the dog. The warden's office tried to seize KO but couldn't because by the time crews arrived, the dog was confined and the owner has a proper license.

The warden now says he'll send three citations to court. The citations range from improper confinement at the time of the alleged attack, no insurance, and no rabies shots.
