Cedar Council rejects pit bull ban

CEDAR CITY — Cedar City councilors did not include a ban on pit bulls when they voted to update the city's animal control ordinance Wednesday night.

Christy Hugh, a resident who brought the proposal forward with her neighbor Seval Burr, said the policies councilors passed aren't good enough.

But Russ Mead, counsel for Best Friends Animal Society and opponent of the pit bull ban, said he's pleased with the new ordinance.

"It's the absolute best approach to protect the public against dog bites," Mead said.

Also during the meeting, councilors passed changes to the city's business license ordinance, accepted an agreement for the Heritage development and approved a contract for a fiber optic line.
